



Web site Webmaster report – Our website has been updated, so please visit it and let Brian know how much you appreciate it. Brian could use any articles to post on the site as well.


Activities Report – Brian gave an update on the upcoming activities.

Considering how it looked, with the top in rags, primered body and a dent in the left rear quarter panel, it ran very well. I paid him, got the title and drove it home. I did a lot of research on the car and found out it was ordered from Dan Day Pontiac in Fresno. The person who ordered it, put a heavy-duty hitch on it and towed a travel trailer. Later on, it was parked for a number of years.

I got a history of the car from the Pontiac Historical Research Center in Detroit Michigan. To my amazement, it was ordered with about every option you could get of: AC, power windows, AM/FM Radio, power seats, cruise control, shoulder seat belts (very rare) 455, rear speakers, trunk release, tilt steering wheel and power door locks. The only thing it did not come with was Rally II Wheels, which I later put on. After taking the whole car apart, the stainless went to Dave Turner for repair and buffing while the car went to Reedley to be painted in the original light blue color. After it was painted, it was off to the upholstery shop for a new white top, Camel interior and carpet. At this time I did not take the Engine out, but it was detailed. I haven't driven this car for two years. My next project is to go through the engine, transmission and suspension to make it a very reliable driver. The 1970's car is the last of the high compression engines. In 1971, the compression came down to meet new smog rules. Now we have California State Senator Dean Florez (D) District 16, introducing a bill wanting to have all cars 45 years and older smogged. HOW RIDICULOUS, since smog equipment didn't even start showing up on cars until 1966. Call, email or write your Congressman and let them know.
