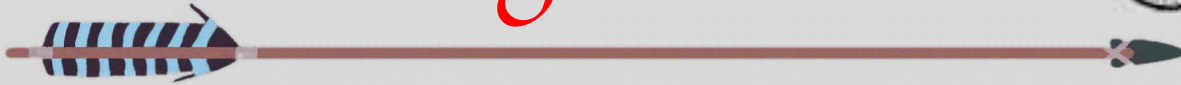

The 2008 Pontiacs of Central California Toys for Tots Car Show was held on Saturday, Nov 8th. The event included the entry of over 200 cars and occurred in cooperation with the US Marine Reserves' kick off weekend for the 2008 Toys for Tots drive, in the Central Valley. At the conclusion of the event and after the official count by the US Marines, it was determined that over 500 new Toys had



been donated. This year it was decided to add a 50/50 drawing to the event with 50 % going to the drawing winner and 50 % to the marines for the Toys for Tots drive. The winner was Sam—I only bought 5 tickets—Troncoso. He walked away with about \$473 but, more importantly, the Marines received almost \$800 from the 50/50 and the direct cash donations made by many of the car show participants.

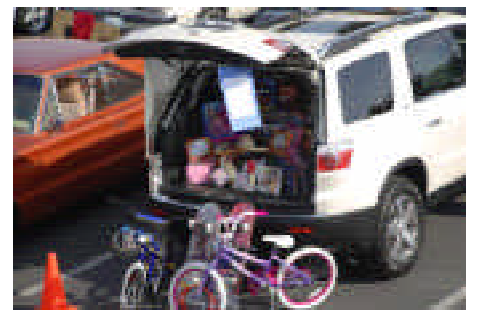
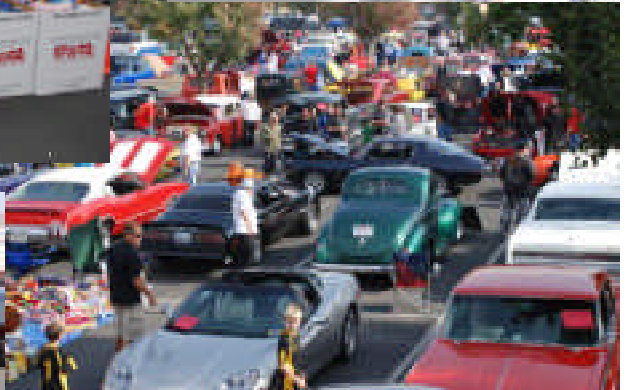
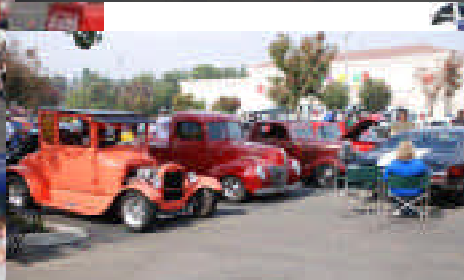
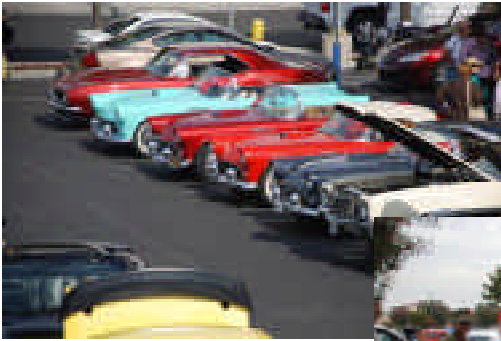
Even prior to the official car show start time it was apparent that the number of cars was rapidly approaching the maximum we could fit in to the designated space for the car show. We had about 2/3rds of the Toys R us parking lot, which we filled including a lot of the aisle space. In addition, many cars were seen parked in the other 1/3rd of the lot that was left for Toys R Us customers. Although we had 185 registered cars, after running out of window placards and looking at the number of cars parked outside the show area, the real total was well over 200 cars. I guess we should explore some alternatives for next year as this show has consistently gained in popularity over the last 3 or 4 years. The many people who jumped in to assist with parking also made a difference. It turned a situation that could of upset participants into at least something that was bearable and understandable by the participants.

A special thanks to Judy and Joel for taking care of the awards portion of the show. The voting and counting process is a very difficult job that was amplified by the larger than expected attendance—the bobble heads were great too! In addition, Sam and Elaine did a great job with registration especially by adapting and improvising when we ran short of registration supplies. Thanks to Brian and Janet for providing their motor home, which always helps. Janet was pleased that she didn't have to spend most of her time making coffee as in the past. Also a thanks to *Kitahara Pontiac* for the donation of \$500 cash to buy toys and the loan of a vehicle to bring them to the show, *Toys R Us* for the generous use of their parking lot, *Sean Ford (Dr. Moonstone)* for donating his DJ services and *Starbucks Coffee* for the great coffee;
