Activity Committee Goals

At our recent monthly meeting some confusion arose regarding Club Events, and the procedure to put them in place. As the Activity Committee Chair I have to apologize to the club for not bringing the goals of the committee to your attention sooner; I hope that this letter will clear up any misunderstanding and confusion.

At the outset of this year, I took on the role of Activity Committee Chair with the stipulation that Greg Griggs and Ron Berglund would stand in as the two Vice Chairs. They accepted and have been working with me since. At the outset the "Tri-Power" committee had three goals:

- Keep the calendar planned several months in advance;
- Present various types of events; and
- Pace the events to keep the calendar balanced.

During the course of the year we hope this agenda will please "most of the people most of the time"; no attempt will be made to please "everyone all the time". In order to accomplish this goal, the committee feels that generally speaking, it must be in control of the calendar. This is not to say we want to "dictate" what the club does, not at all.
